In the weeks ahead, I'm looking forward to returning to Israel for our WIZO Victoria Yom Hazikaron and Yom Ha'atzmaut Solidarity Mission, where we will witness firsthand the unwavering unity that defines us.

Despite the trials we have endured both individually and as an organization, WIZO has remained steadfast in its commitment to rebuilding Israel and supporting its citizens. From providing essential aid to the displaced, and launching emergency services for vulnerable people, WIZO has exemplified the spirit of compassion and solidarity.

Here in Melbourne, October 7th served as a significant wake-up call for the Jewish community. Since then, we launched our Emergency Appeal to raise critical funds for Israel during wartime. The Better Together Kitchen's Feast for Peace, Zoe Levin's Marathon run and dance for peace raised money for this appeal. Thus far, our appeal has raised over \$400,000 with 100% of the funds going directly to Israel.

While raising money for Israel,

- 3. contributed to sending essential supplies to Israel,
- 4. among other efforts.

The rise in anti-Jewish and anti-Israel senti-ment in Melbourne has also compelled WIZO Victoria to take action in the advocacy arena, sending letters to parliamentarians and more, to ensure our community has a strong voice.

I take great pride in being an integral member of the WIZO community, dedicated to giving back to Israel. As, now, a diaspora Israeli, I can truly appreciate and understand the vital role that the Jewish state plays in my life.
